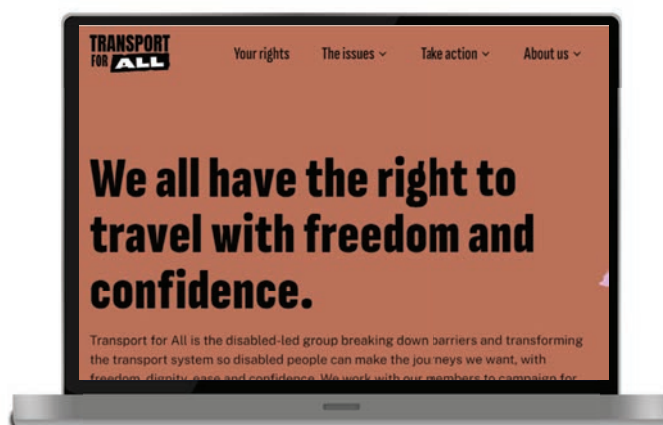
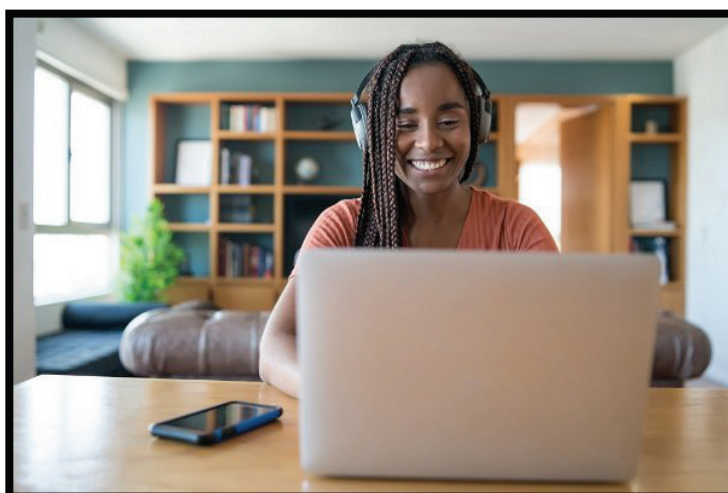
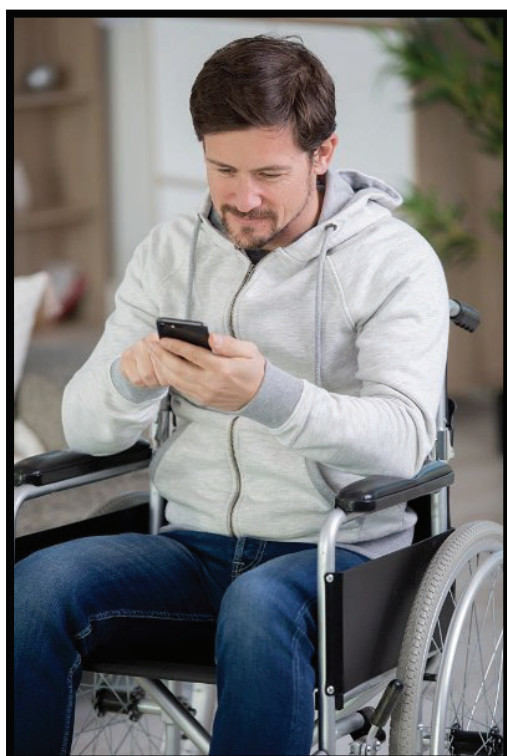




Making sure everyone can use our website



What is an accessible website



A **website** is a place where you can get information online. You look at a website on a computer, tablet or phone.



The law says we have to tell people how **accessible** our website is.



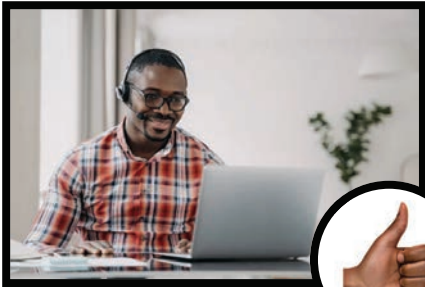
Accessible means easy for everyone to use.

About the Transport for All website

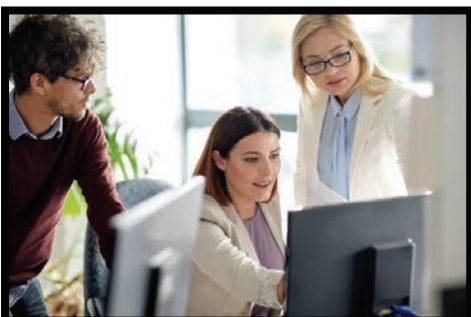
We are Transport for All. We want to make local streets and public transport accessible.



It is really important to us that we are accessible in all our work and our website.



We want to make sure everyone can use our website. This includes people who are blind, deaf or disabled.



We have looked at our website. We have thought about how it looks and if it is easy to read and use.

Things we have done to make our website easy for everyone to use



We have:

- thought about meeting people's needs when we planned and built our website



- added a button at the top of each page

The button lets you change how the website looks by changing the colour.



- used black words on a light coloured background on our web pages. This makes the words clear and easy for people to read



- added a new web page on our website for events. If you want to book on an event, you can now do it on our web page



- made sure we give important information in lots of different ways. Things like easy read and British Sign Language



- worked together with a group of people to check our website. The group is made up of our members, **experts** and disabled people.

An **expert** is someone who knows a lot about something



The group has helped us with things like:

- checking the website is easy for everyone to use

and



- telling us which are the best colours and **fonts** to use.

A **font** is the type of writing and how the letters look.

Here we have written the words **Transport for all** in different fonts:

More things we have done

We have:

- made sure any pictures we use on our website have **alt text**

Alt text is words telling you what you can see in the picture. When you click on a picture, you can see or listen to the alt text.



This can help people who are blind or find it hard to see.



We have deleted any pictures that do not have a description

Things we want to do to make our website better



We will keep checking our website to make sure it is as accessible as possible.



We doing some work to make sure our issues page is in British Sign Language.

This will make it easier for D/deaf people to use our website.



Our issues page looks at the things that make it harder for disabled people to travel.

Changes you can make



We have tried to make it easy for everyone to use our website. But you might need to make other changes too.

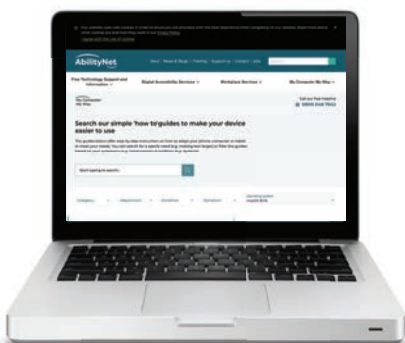


You can change the settings on your computer, tablet or phone.
